'Thy Kingdom Come' starts on Ascension Day next Thursday, 13th May, and continues until Pentecost Sunday. It is a global prayer movement that invites Christians to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. During the 11 days of 'Thy Kingdom Come', it is hoped that everyone who takes part will:

- •Deepen their own relationship with Jesus Christ.
- •Pray for 5 friends or family to come to faith in Jesus.

• Pray for the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to be effective in their witness.

After the very first Ascension Day the disciples came together and were constantly in prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, which happened at Pentecost. We like them need the gift of the Holy Spirit, because on our own we can do nothing.

For centuries Christians have gathered at this time of year to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit. 'Thy Kingdom Come' is a continuation of this. It started in 2016 and now Christians from 172 countries have taken part.

You can pray in your own way but there are some helpful resources available:

Prayer Journal: A short Bible reading, prayer and reflection for each day with space for your own notes.

Novena: a nine-day series of reflections and prayers based on various Psalms.

There are resources for children and youth too.

Prayer Focus Update

As you know from the news, India is desperately struggling with the ravages of a second wave of COVID.

In Kolkata (Calcutta) the situation is desperate. The city is in lockdown but thousands of poor have nowhere to go so they are dying on the streets. Their deaths are not recorded. Their bodies are burnt by petrol on the road side each night. Their children left to fend for themselves. The military in Kolkata are in total lockdown in their camps so cannot give help to the civilian authorities as they would do normally.

One of MMI's co-workers is an amazing Indian Pastor – Pastor Blesson is very concerned for his safety next week. He has to go to South India—a 40 hours journey by train or 4 hours flight, but because Jaya (his wife) is locked down as part of the medical staff in the hospital he will have to take children with him Blesson has been vaccinated. Pray for the Lord's protection and release from the need for this journey Pastor Samuel Mathai and his son Steven Samuel, both have Covid and have asked to 'be upheld with your sincerest prayers' – that is all we have to help us'.

The son of a General (we will call him M) military Christian leader, who we prayed for last week has sadly died. This has shaken the military Christian community in that area of India as well as M's church community. They believed in faith that when a bed was found the son would recover. Please pray for M as he deals with his loss while people watch him to see if his faith survives and asking him how he explains it.

Pray wisdom for those involved in planning the Covid recovery against a background of continuing massed religious gatherings (Kumbh Mela), multiple COVID variants, difficult oxygen distribution situation and a slow roll-out of vaccines. Many thanks, Susie
